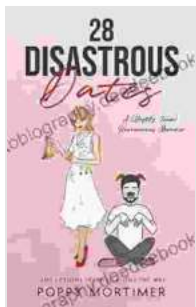

I never saw him again.

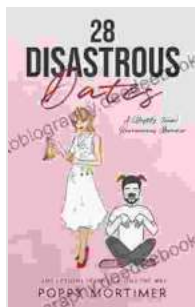
