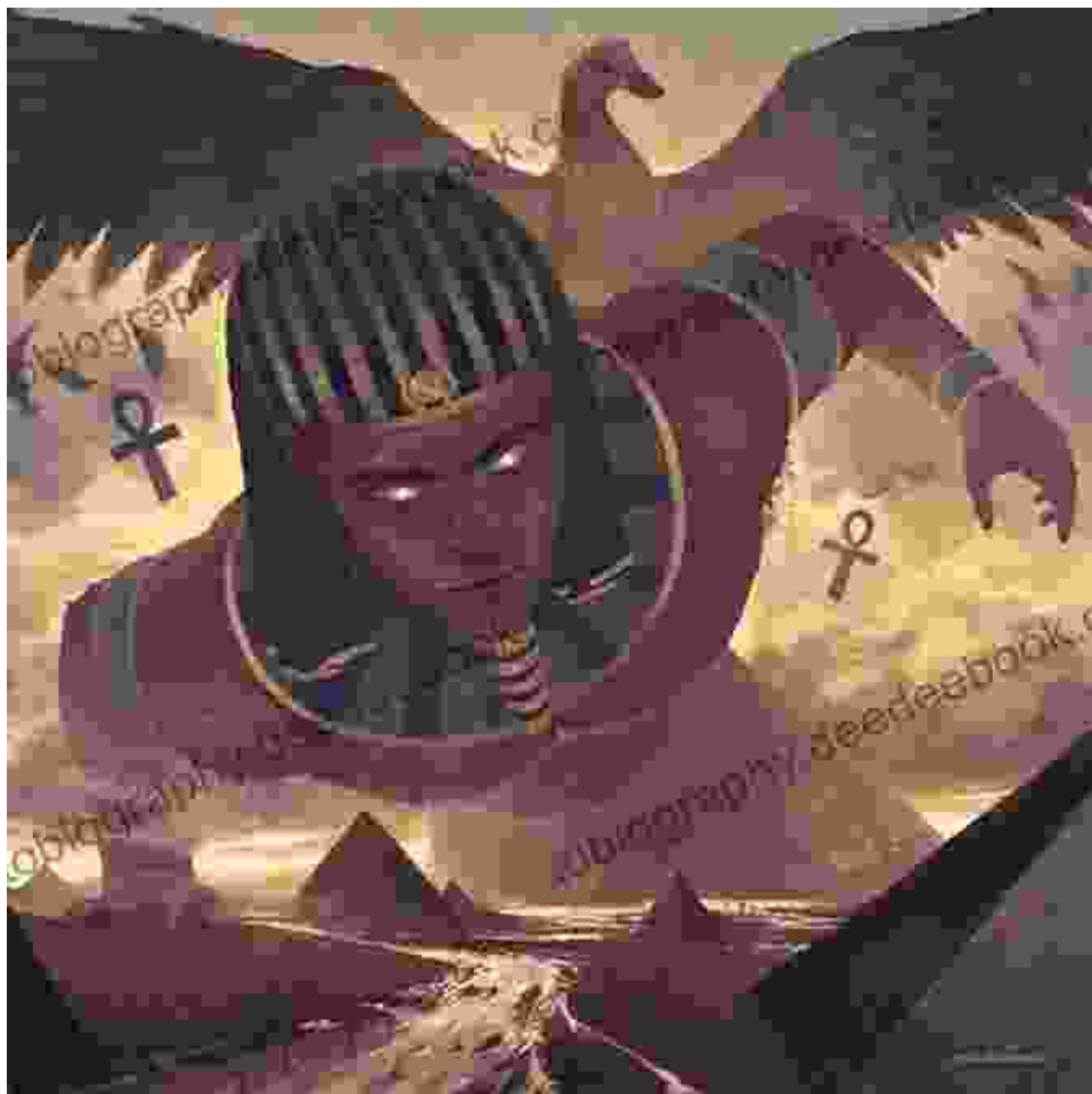

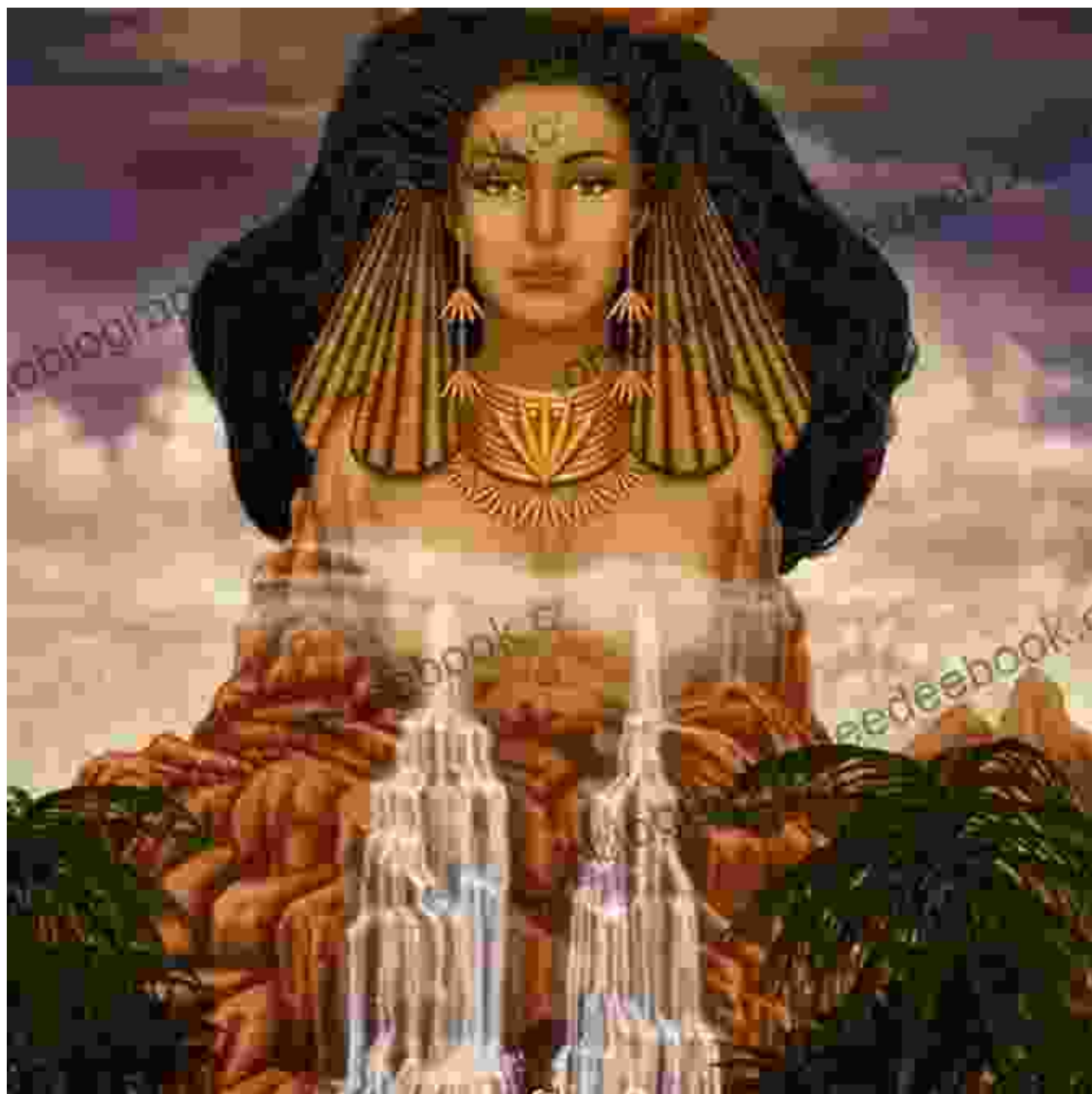

## Isis

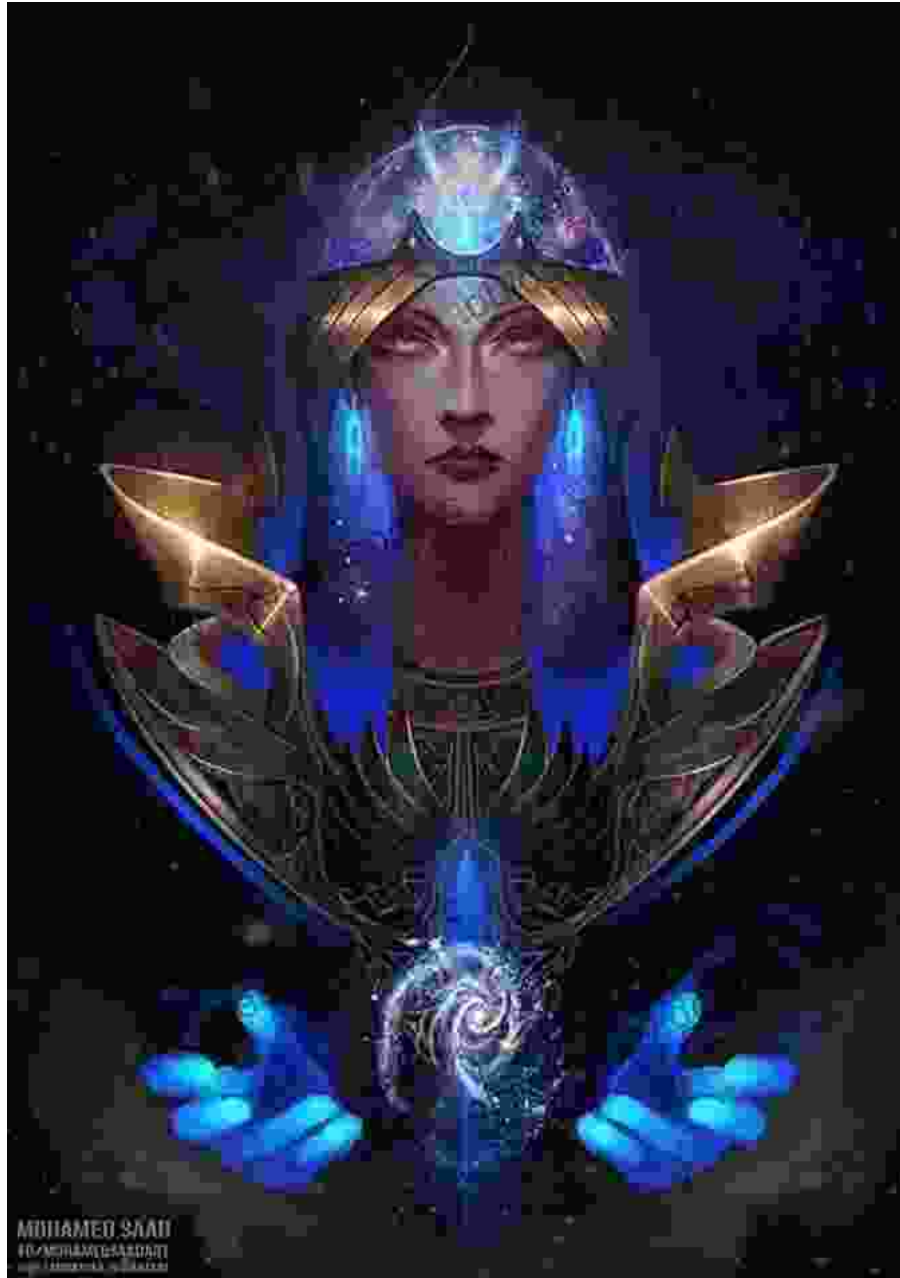

Nut was the goddess of the sky. She was often depicted as a woman arched over the earth, and she was the mother of the stars.





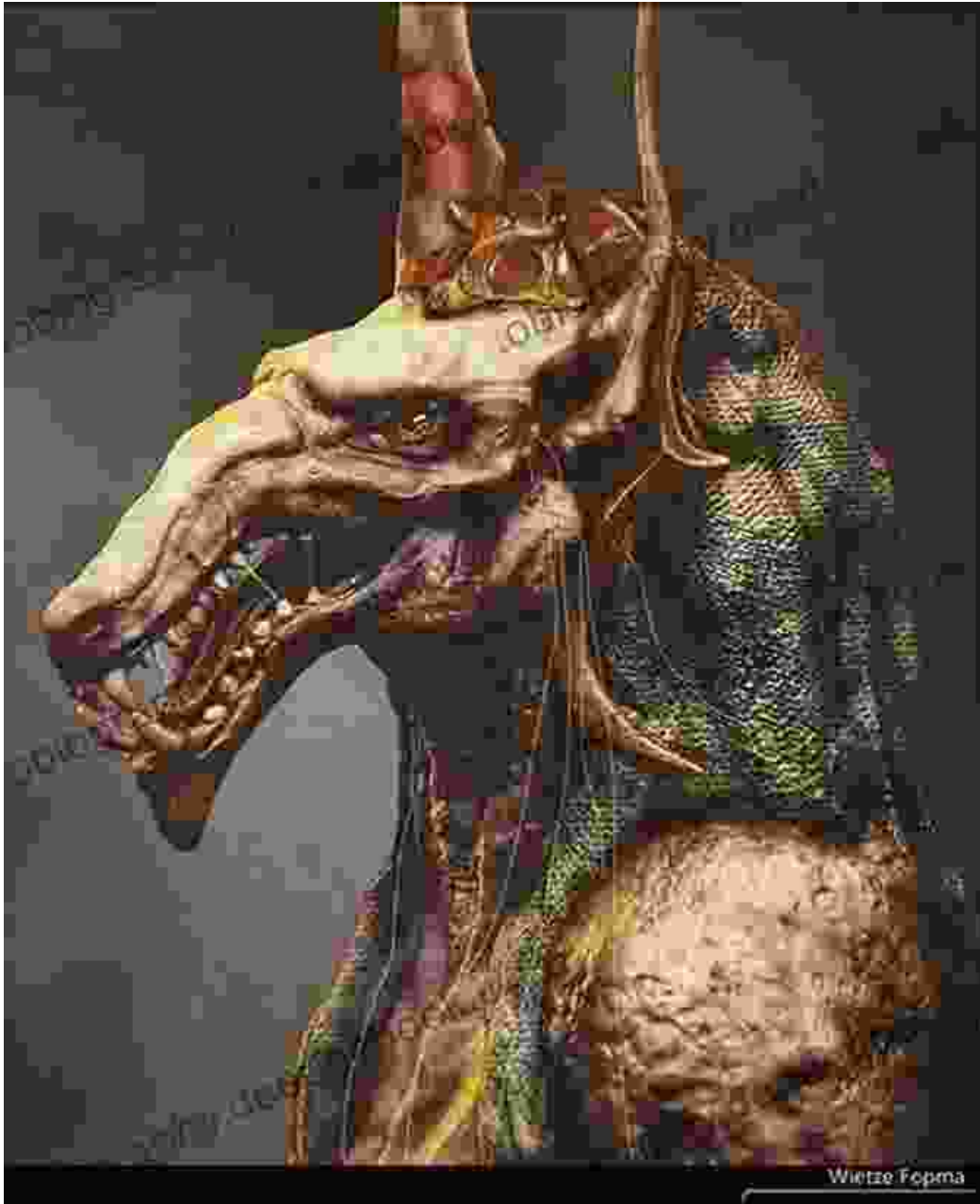
## Osiris
