Materials you'll need:

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- 18 gauge wire (gold, silver, or copper)
- 24 gauge wire (gold, silver, or copper)

- Star shaped earring posts
- Round nose pliers
- Wire cutters
- Optional: beads or charms

1. **Cut a piece of 18 gauge wire about 12 inches long.** This will be the base of your earring. 2. **Bend the wire in half to form a loop.** The loop should be about 1 inch wide. 3. **Thread the star shaped earring post onto the loop.** 4. **Use the round nose pliers to close the loop.** 5. **Cut a piece of 24 gauge wire about 6 inches long.** This will be the star shape. 6. **Fold the wire in half and then in half again.** You should now have a small square. 7. **Bend the square into a triangle.** 8. **Bend the triangle into a star shape.** 9. **Thread the star shape onto the loop of the earring base.** 10. **Use the round nose pliers to close the loop.** 11. **Optional: Add beads or charms to the earrings.** 12. **Your star shaped earrings are now complete!**

Tips:

* If you want to make your earrings more durable, you can use a stronger gauge of wire. * You can also use different colors of wire to create different looks. * If you're using beads or charms, be sure to secure them tightly so they don't fall off. * Have fun and be creative with your earrings!

Troubleshooting:

* If your star shape is not symmetrical, you can try bending it again. * If the loop on the earring base is too large, you can use the round nose pliers to

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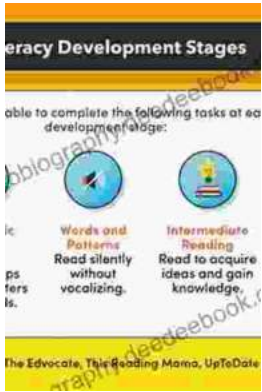
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
