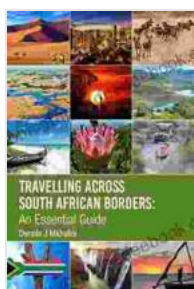

- The Vioolsdrift Border Post between South Africa and Namibia

When crossing the border, you will need to present your passport and visa (if required). You may also be asked to provide proof of your onward travel arrangements.

Customs Regulations

There are a number of items that are not permitted to be brought into or out of South Africa. These items include:

- Firearms and ammunition
- Dangerous drugs
- Counterfeit goods
- Pornography
- Live animals (without a permit)
- Fresh fruits and vegetables
- Meat and dairy products

If you are carrying any of these items, you will need to declare them to customs when you cross the border. You may be asked to pay duty on these items.

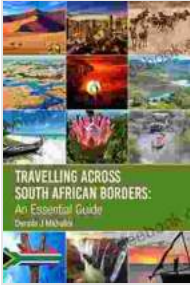
